



Q5 - Please describe any 'pearls' or takeaway messages.

- My biggest takeaway message is the importance of helping the family come up with a plan of action. This helps the family understand what they can expect and be able to plan for it.
- Mrs. Christine Sutton, the wife of my deceased classmate Gerald Sutton DO, (Class of '76) made a huge impact by describing the caregiving to a caregiver with early onset Alzheimer's Disease. She described the worsening of his symptoms ultimately leading to being placed in a nursing home where he formerly rounded on in-patients. It was a very courageous sharing of an emotionally traumatic chapter in their lives. She has given this presentation with Dr. Selden Spencer four times and I applaud their cooperative approach - the emotional and the medical/scientific aspects of Alzheimer's Disease. I hope the medical students were as impressed as I was by this lecture.
- Dementia can have very different presentations in different patients. Caregivers should be connected with resources so they are not isolated and overworked when caring for loved ones with dementia.
- What a moving story! My pearl was the quote "Once you have seen one Alzheimer's patient, you have seen ONE Alzheimer's patient."
