- It's really helpful when well-respected, experienced surgeons are willing to show and discuss cases that did not go to plan. Was a great learning experience overall.
- Being a young surgeon still, I think that the clinical experience and perspective speaks volumes on what discussions need to happen prior to any surgery, such as patient selection, what their medical and social history is like potential for complications and revision surgery. Thinking about the large talar dome lesion case knowing your patient well, the expectations and deciding what procedure to do and when are vital to having a successful surgery. The Evans case was very helpful realizing that even when thinking about just performing an Evans, where exactly to start your Evans cut is it critical at 1 or 1.3cm, do you cut the medial cortex, are we overstuffing this, creating potential for nonunion and leaving maybe leaving residual valgus. with adding a medial slide you can rely less on the Evans and use a smaller graft to achieve correction of the flatfoot. I really enjoyed all the lectures tonight, high value highly relevant

- Arthrodiastis is an outdated surgical intervention that is not used as often.

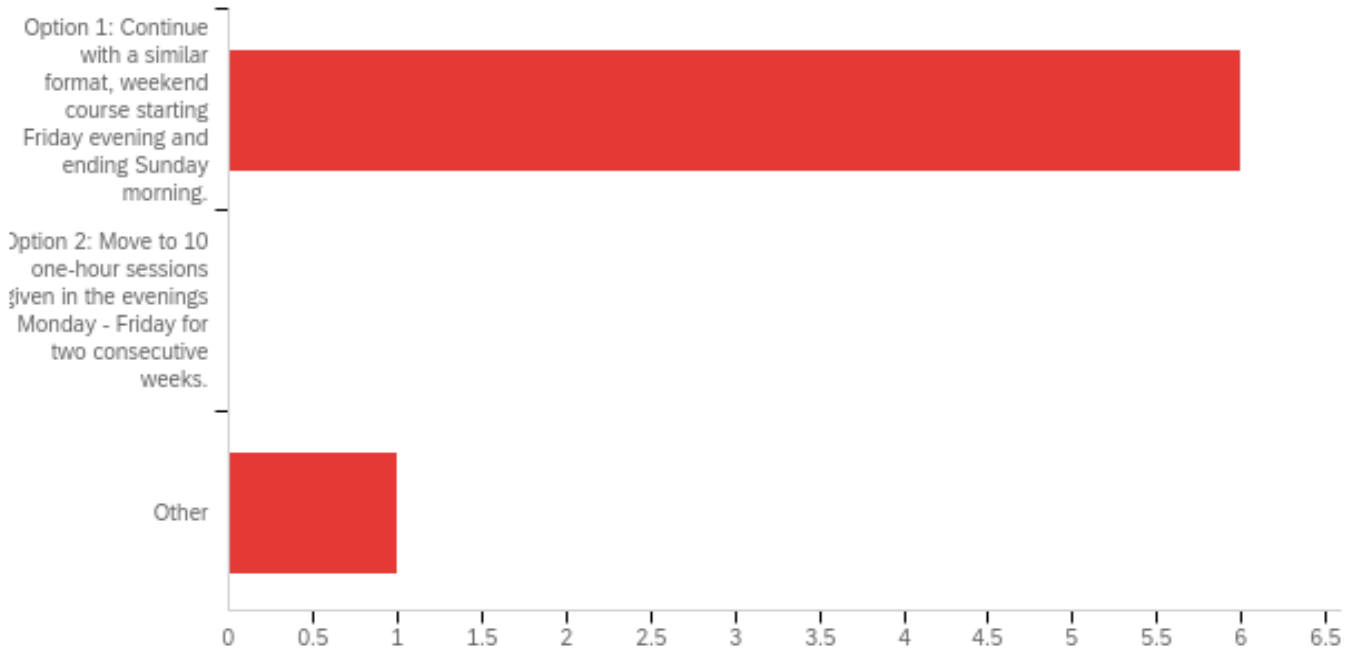
