

The lowa Primary Care Association is honored to present the third annual Carl Kulczyk Memorial Award. Carl was the Director of the lowa Department of Public Health Primary Care Office for 14 years. He served on the lowa/Nebraska Primary Care Association Board of Directors from 1995 to 2008; serving on the Executive Committee as Board Secretary for several years.

Carl was recognized in lowa, Washington D.C., and across the nation as an expert in primary care and the medically underserved. He worked passionately and tirelessly to ensure lowa communities could offer quality health care to their residents regardless of ability to pay.

Carl also offered placement assistance to physicians and other health care providers including foreign medical graduates. Carl believed in finding the perfect fit between facility, community and provider.

Carl had a very special blend of passion, humor, determination and a high intelligence. He dedicated himself to serving others. As Senator Tom Harkin remarked, "Carl worked miracles for people who desperately needed a miracle. The expansion of affordable, accessible health care services across lowa would not have happened without Carl's hard work."

Carl viewed life as an adventure and once you got to know Carl you joined in to share the excitement and reap the rewards of serving others. Carl loved helping people, but he also loved to laugh. He had a quick wit and enjoyed playing the occasional practical joke. Carl often said, "If they only knew they would make me the king if they could..."




